Joseph Rises to Power

Key Passages: Genesis 41:1–8, 41:15–16, 41:39–43, 41:48–49



Lesson Focus

God gave Pharaoh two disturbing dreams that his wise men couldn't interpret. The cupbearer remembered Joseph from the prison and recommended him to Pharaoh. Giving God the credit for his gift, Joseph explained that Pharaoh's dreams were a warning of seven years of famine after seven years of plenty. Pharaoh honored Joseph and gave him a powerful position to prepare Egypt for the famine.





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Egyptian Collar Craft

Materials

- ☐ Paper plates
- ☐ Bowl or jar about 4–6 inches in diameter for tracing a circle
- ☐ Glue
- ☐ Scissors
- ☐ Crayons
- ☐ Decorations: beads, stickers, dry pasta, glitter, jewels, ribbon, etc.

Instructions

Use the bowl or jar (4–6 inches across) to draw a circle on the back of each paper plate about 1 inch from the edge. Cut one slit from the edge of the plate to the circle and cut the circle out. Leave the edge to go around the student's neck.

Give one cut plate to each student. (Older students may wish to cut their own plates.) Have the students write "The Lord was with Joseph" on the plate near the bottom. (Assist younger students with writing as necessary.) Help students glue and add decorations to make a fancy collar.

After glue is dry, open the cut edge and wrap it around the student's neck to wear.

Suggested Discussion

Joseph was a slave and a prisoner. But God put him in the right place at the right time to help Pharaoh understand his dreams. And Pharaoh made Joseph a ruler of Egypt!

We often see pictures of Egyptian rulers wearing fancy jewelry, crowns, and collars. You can wear your Egyptian collar for fun. When you do, think about Joseph. He didn't understand why God let him stay there in the prison, but God had a plan all along. He made sure Joseph was right where he needed to be so he could explain Pharaoh's dreams, become a ruler, and save the lives of many people when the famine came.
