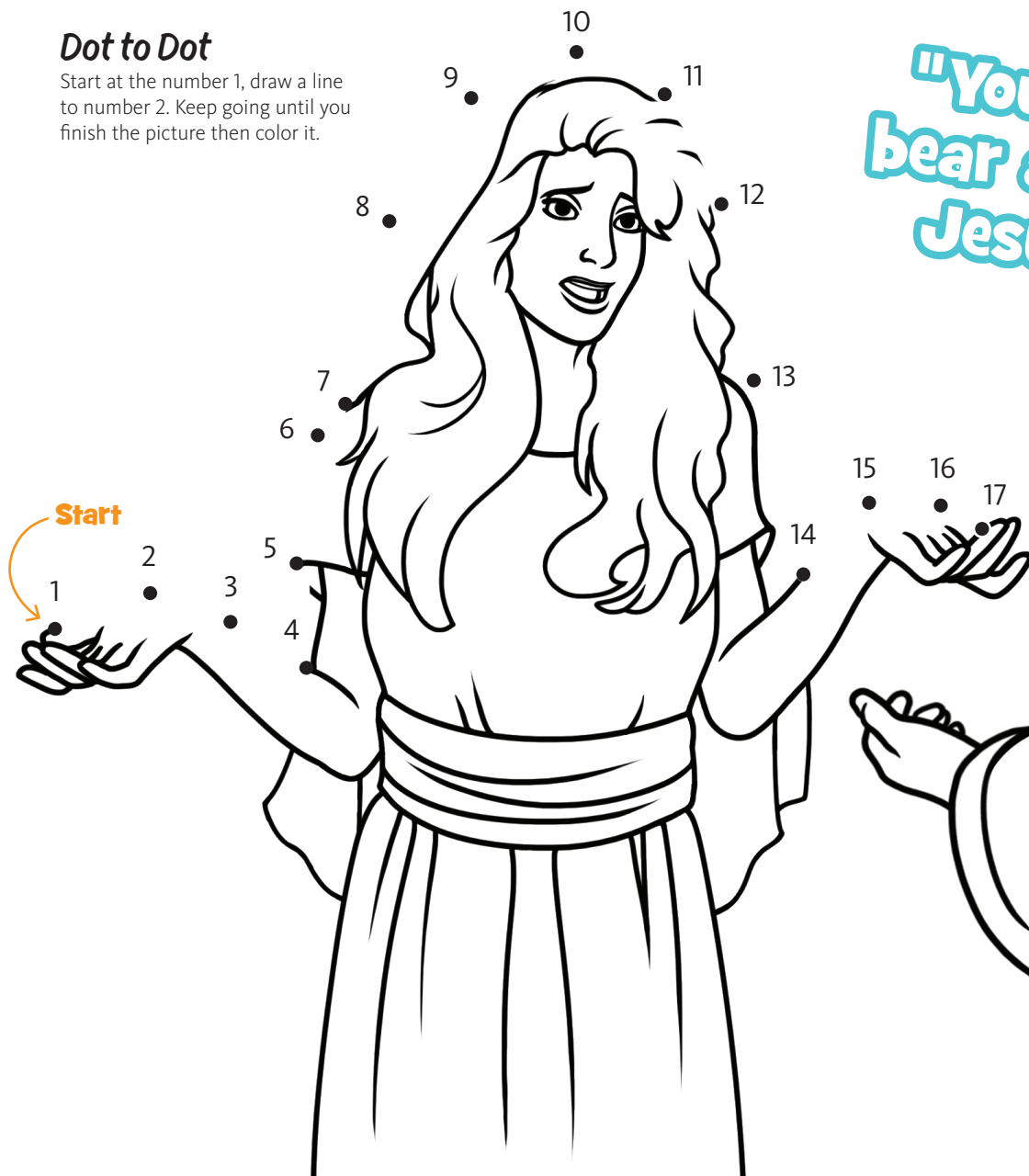

Luke 2:10-11

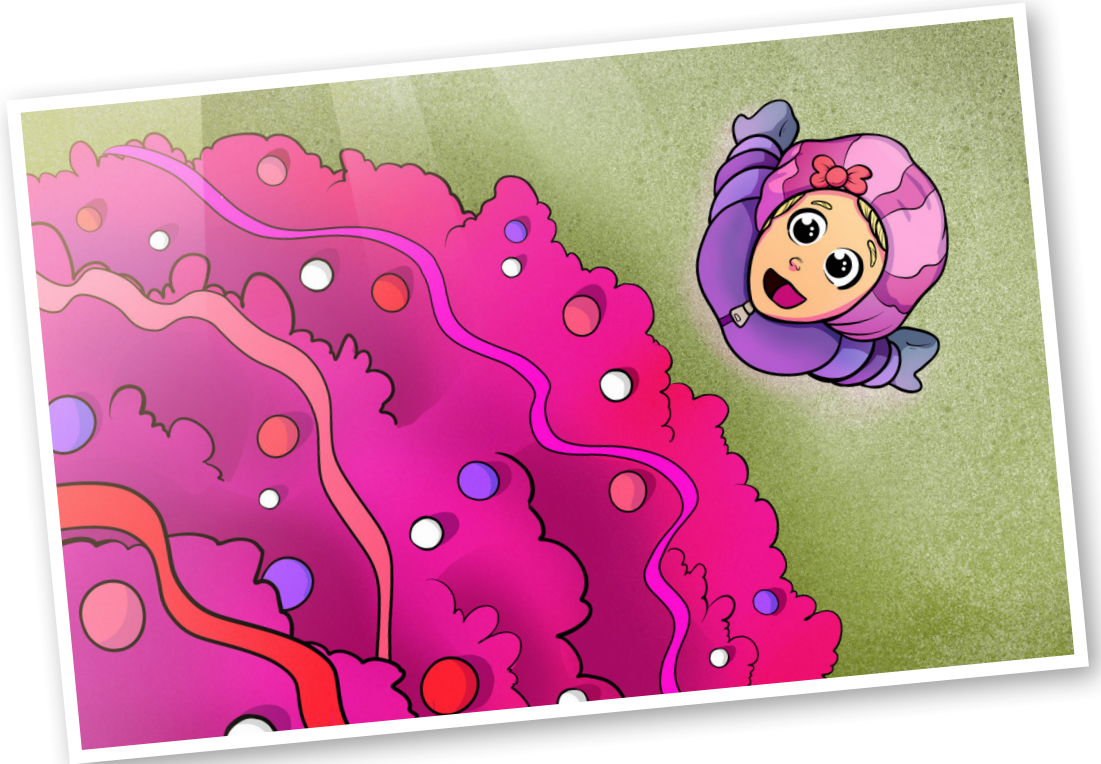
