OPENING THOUGHTS

1. Do you believe that there is anything that God cannot do? If so, list a few of them here. *Many may think that God can do anything.*

WHAT DOES THE WORD SAY?

2. When a man takes an oath, he swears by something greater than himself. In Hebrews 6:13–18, what does God base His oath on? *Explain whether this is reasonable or not. God bases His oath on Himself. Since He is God, there is nothing greater that He could swear by, so this is reasonable.*
3. What common idea do you find in Hebrews 6:18 and Titus 1:2? *God cannot lie.*

CONNECTING THE DOTS

4. Where do we find out about God and His will? *From the Bible.*
5. Since God wrote the Bible (2 Peter 1:19–21), is there any standard greater than the Bible? *God Himself is the greatest standard, but since He wrote the Bible, it has equal authority as a supreme standard.*
6. If God cannot lie and God wrote the Bible, what can we conclude about the contents of the Bible? *God's Word is true and without error.*
