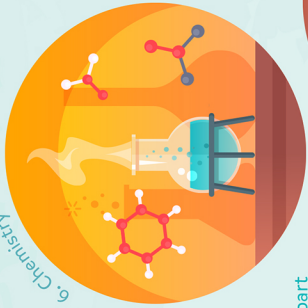


6. Chemistry
