Family Devotion time

The Apostle Paul sent a letter to his friend Timothy, explaining that we live in a cold, hard world: "In the last days there will come times of difficulty. For people will

be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, heartless, . . . without self-control, brutal, not loving good" (2 Timothy 3:1-3).

Paul wrote these words from a Roman prison. He was locked away for telling people about how Jesus

Christ can forgive us and change our evil ways. Paul looked around and saw people being selfish and cruel everywhere.

Here's the Deal

We live in a cold, cruel world. But Jesus has equipped his followers with everything they need to keep living for him.

Maybe you look around and see people living like that, too. It can be discouraging. But even in a dark prison, Paul was confident and encouraged to keep living for

> God and sharing the good news about Jesus. He knew how we're supposed to live. God didn't leave us to fend for ourselves in the cold, but he gave us the Bible: "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16-17).
