

# Bugs, Bugs, Everywhere ...

**Mosquito**

Annoying insects that bite!

**Long-Horned Beetle**

These beetles are named after the long antennae they have. And there are about 20,000 different species (or types) of them.

**Lantern Fly**

These bugs aren't flies or lanterns—they are planthoppers. Yep, they get around by "hopping" from plant to plant.

**Long-Horned Beetle**

Those huge jaws (mandibles) are menacing. This species has extra-large mandibles and lives in the Amazon rainforest.

**Grasshopper**

They can hop, walk, and—if they have wings—fly.

**Blowfly**

Small hairs on their feet help them taste the surface they are walking on. You probably wouldn't want to taste the things they do!

**Katydid**

Their name comes from the sound they make. Some people say it sounds like "Katy did, Katy didn't."

**Scarab Beetle**

You may have heard of Japanese beetles, June beetles, and Goliath beetles—all are members of the same species.

**Ladybug**

Farmers love them because they eat aphids (small, soft bugs that kill plants).

**Honeybee**

The honey they produce starts with sweet liquid (nectar) they get from flowers.

**Stick Insect**

It is designed to look like a branch or twig so insect-eaters can't see them.

**Ants**

Ants live in colonies (groups of related ants). Each colony has one or more queens, workers, and soldiers.
