### IMPACT OF 'BIG BANG' EXPERIMENT:

Answers in Genesis' Ken Ham Available to Explain Why Scientists Are Alternately Excited or Fearful; Likely Results of this Test

**WHAT:** Scientists around the world will be watching tomorrow as a group of their peers hope to recreate the "big bang," in miniscule, in a 17-mile underground tunnel along the French-Swiss border. **DETAILS:** Evolutionists have long touted a "Big Bang," for the origins of the universe, as the "spark" that started the evolutionary process. There is no possible way to re-create this supposed event, so it has never been definitively proven or disproven. A group of French and Swiss scientists have joined together to try and recreate the event, on an infinitesimal scale, to see if they can learn anything from it about the origins of the universe.

Other scientists have cautioned against the attempt, as it involves smashing particle beams together at close to the speed of light. They are worried the subsequent explosions could lead to physical changes in the planet's structure.
