The "Bethlehem's Blessings" Christmas Celebration also includes havrides, seasonal lights and foods, and Christmas Concerts each Friday evening. Outdoor events are all free to the public. The planetarium program is \$7.00 with museum admission (or \$8.00 alone) and the Christmas Concerts featuring Ray Cummins, Buddy Davis and Geri Campbell are \$2.00.

The museum itself will be free and open to the public on December 24 (9 a.m. - 3 p.m.) as a Christmas gift to the community as the museum celebrates the gift of God to the world: Jesus Christ. The celebration runs through Jan. 4.
