
# Extra Mount K Climber

**ALL AGES** 



#### Materials

- ☐ Jumbo craft sticks, 1 per child
- ☐ Mount K Climber pattern
- ☐ White cardstock, 1 sheet for every 2 children
- ☐ Plastic straws, two 1-in. pieces per child
- ☐ Yarn, 6 feet per child
- ☐ Pony beads, 2 per child

## Tools and Basic Supplies

- ☐ Glue sticks
- ☐ Scissors
- ☐ Crayons, highlighters, or markers
- ☐ Hand drill with a 1/8-in. drill bit
- ☐ Invisible tape

#### Pre-Prep

- Photocopy the Mt. K Climber patterns onto white cardstock and quick cut to separate, one set per boy and one set per girl. The kids will do the finish cutting.
- 2. Drill three ½-in. holes in each of the craft sticks—one near each end and one in the middle.
- 3. Cut the yarn into strands of 6 ft. for each child. Then cut an 8-in. piece from each 6 ft. strand and cut the remaining length (64-in.) in half. Each child should then have one 8-in. piece and two 32-in. pieces.
- 4. Cut straws into 1-in. pieces, 2 per child.

### **Class Time Directions**

- Use crayons, highlighters, or markers to color your Mt.
  K Climber pieces, then cut them out.
- 2. To make a loop for hanging, tie the ends of the smaller piece of yarn together. Then feed the other end (opposite the knotted end) through the middle hole in the

- craft stick. Then feed the knotted end through the loop and pull tight.
- piece of yarn and thread one end through one of the end holes in the craft stick. Then tie a double knot so it will not pull back through the hole. Do the same with the other piece of yarn.
- Take the two plastic straw pieces and tape them to the back of the climber (behind the hands and shoulders) so they are a couple inches apart and angled slightly inward at the top.
- 5. Thread the long yarn pieces through the straws on the back of your climber and then tie a bead at each end.
- 6. Glue stick the bottom of the mountain scene to the front of the craft stick.

HOW IT WORKS: Use the center loop to hang your Mt. K Climber craft from a cabinet knob or the back of a door hinge. Then, with the climber at the bottom, gently pull on each beaded end, back and forth, one-at-a-time, and watch the climber ascend to the top.

#### Tip Corner

 You can drill several craft sticks at a time by tightly bundling them together with rubber bands. Some may break because of the direction of the wood grain, so have extras on hand.
