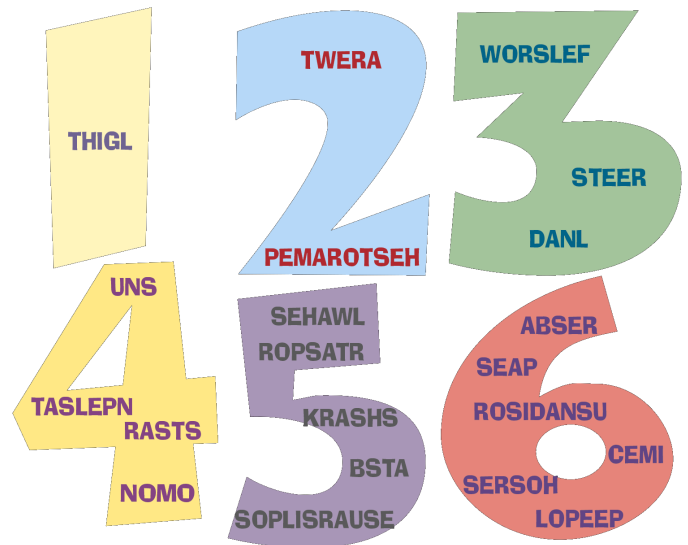

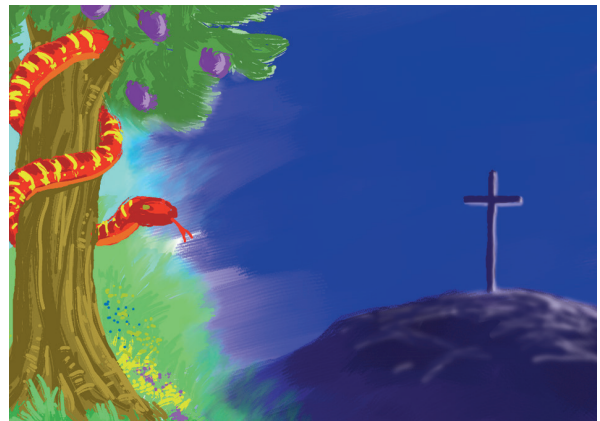

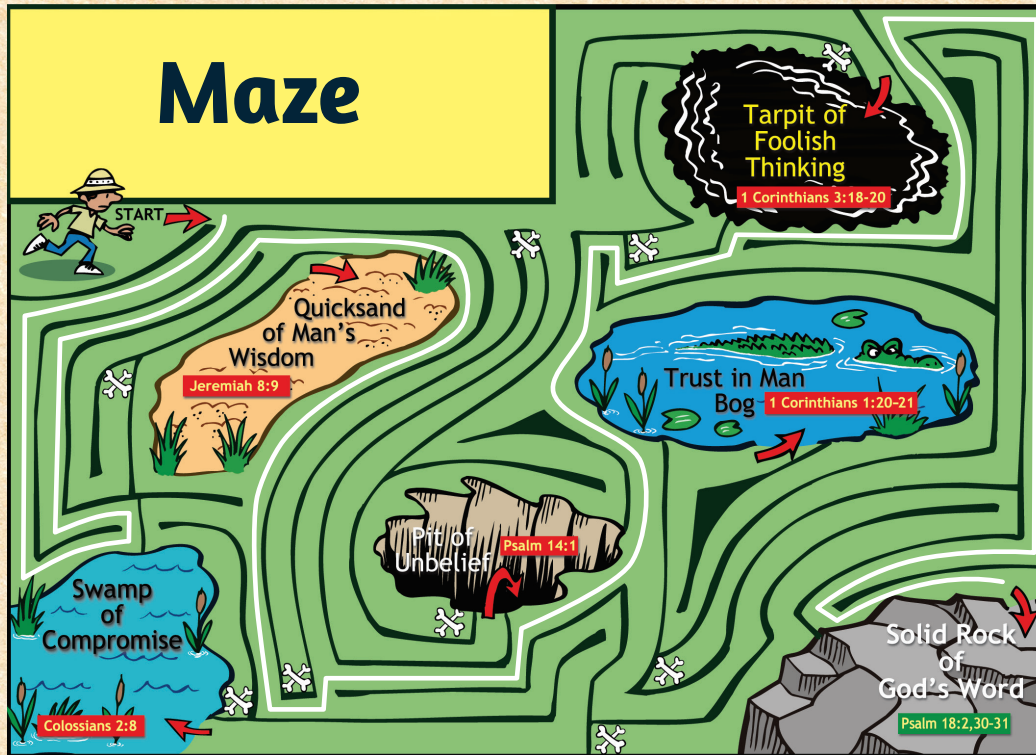

The first "C" is



KEN: We're now going to walk through the Seven C's: Creation, Corruption, Catastrophe, Confusion, then Christ, Cross, Consummation. As we walk through Creation, we are walking through the Garden of Eden. We see Adam with the animals. And as you look

at the animal kinds, by the way, they'll look different from what we see today. And the reason being that we want people to understand the species we see today in horses or in camels are not the same as what would have existed originally. Notice how lush and green the Garden of Eden appears before Adam and Eve sinned; you will see a difference once sin enters the world.

God created a perfect world in six literal (24-hour) days. There was no death, disease, or suffering in God's "very good" creation. There were no thorns, thistles, or geological disasters. The only accurate historical record of creation is found in the book of Genesis.

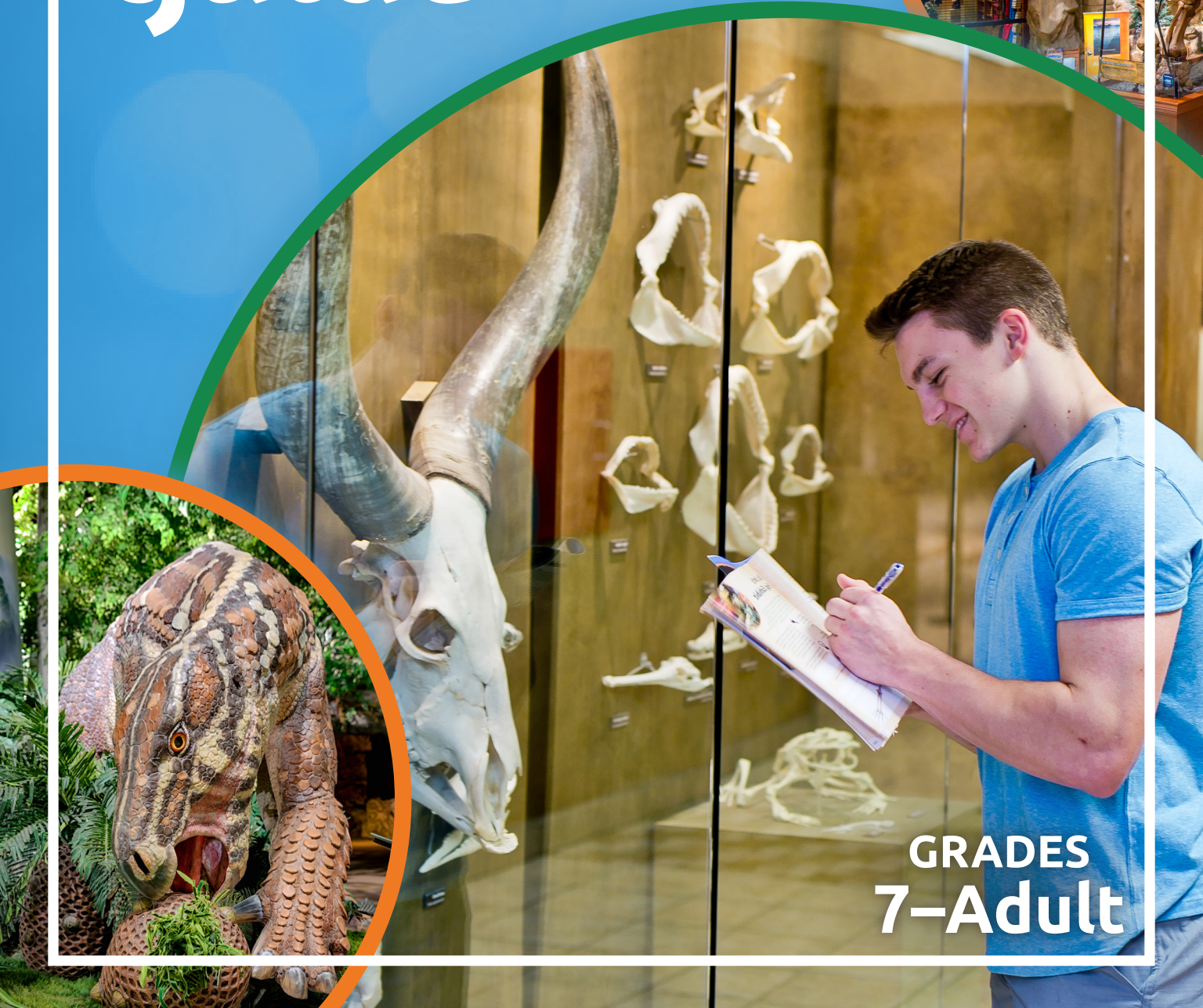

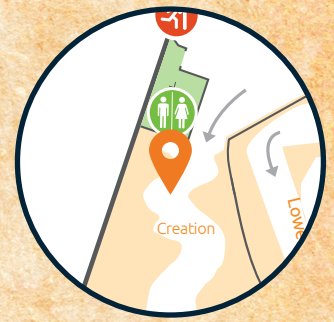

As we walk through Creation, we are walking through the Garden of Eden. We see Adam with the animals. And as you look at the animal kinds, by the way, they'll look different from what we see today. God created "kinds," not the individual species we see today. Notice how lush and green the Garden of Eden appears before Adam and Eve sinned; you will see a difference once sin enters the world.

Short Answer:

Why do you see animals represented that we do not observe in our world today?

Read this expert discussing the created kinds on the ark, "One thing that is evident when looking at animals in the world today, many have specialized to live in specific niches. There are hares that live in the arctic, others that live in the desert, and others in intermediate climates. There are cattle (for example, the yak) that can withstand high altitudes and cold climates; there are other cattle (for example, zebu) that are adapted to live in hot, arid climates. We also see specialization in domestic animals, where some cattle have been bred for milk production and others have been bred for beef production. Given these trends, the ark kinds would be relatively unspecialized animals that fit nicely into the cognitum of the created kind."

What do you see the animals eating?

Vegetation, Genesis 1 clearly describes God's command to eat plants.

How was Adam able to name all the animals in less than one day?

Adam was only required to name the beast of the field, birds of the air, and the cattle. This would only require a short amount of time, less than 24 hours. Genesis 2:18–20

Why do you feel this is significant in relation to Genesis 1?

Adam recognized there was not a creation that looked like him. (Genesis 2:20)

How is the doctrine of marriage defined in the garden of Eden?

God provides the doctrine of marriage between a man and a woman in Genesis 2:23–24: "Then the man said, 'This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man.' Therefore a

man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh."

Was the actual tree of knowledge of good and evil the problem or the act of eating from the tree? How does this relate to baptism or the Lord's supper?

The act of eating from the tree was the problem. God told Adam and Eve to not eat from the tree of knowledge of good and evil, and the taking of the fruit was the disobedient act. The act became a representation of a decision. Similar to baptism or the Lord's supper, the act does not save you but is a reflection of your decision to follow Christ.

Adam Before Sin

- Physical Death: *no death prior to sin*
- Spiritual Death: *designed to live forever and have a relationship with God*
- Physical Health: *no disease, no suffering, no aches and pains, no aging*
- Diet: *plants / vegetables / fruits*
- Stress & Anxiety: *no stress and pressure, working in the garden and caring for animals without tiring*
- Intelligence: *created extremely intelligent*
- Occupation: *dominion over the plants and animals in the garden, naming the animals*

• Relationship with Eve: *intimate, perfect, no strife, jealousy, conflict*

• Relationship with God: *intimate (no separation), personal relationship*

Why does it matter whether creation took six literal days or millions of years?

God used numbers by describing evening and morning as days. In Exodus 20:11, God describes creation in six days. Noah's flood created the fossil record. Jesus referenced to the Old Testament as literal history. Death before sin violates a "very good" creation. Science has not proven millions of years.

The second "C" is *Corruption*

This is not in the student guide, but may be a question youth ask:

Why is the first sin called Adam's sin if Eve is the one with stained hands?

Adam failed at his responsibilities in two ways. He should have stopped his wife from eating since he was there to observe exactly what she was about to eat (Genesis 3:6). Instead of correcting the words of his wife (Genesis 3:17), he listened to her and ate while not being

deceived (1 Timothy 2:14).

We could also argue that Adam failed to keep and guard the garden as he was commanded in Genesis 2:15. God, knowing Satan would fall, gave this command to Adam, but Adam did not complete the task. God knew that Adam would fall short and had a plan specially prepared.

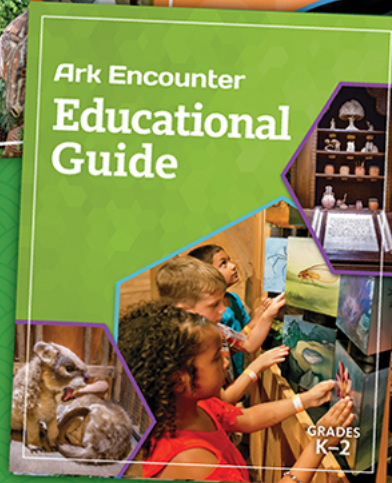
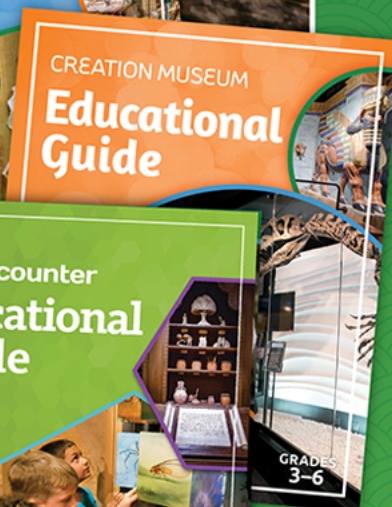
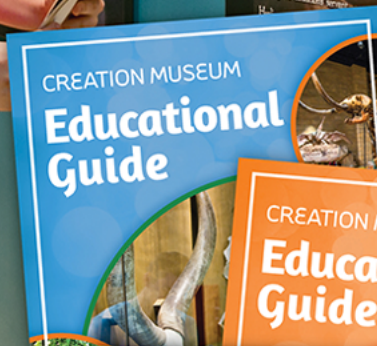
